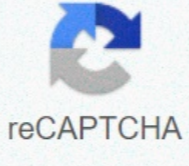




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Robert Cox (Ph.D., University of Pittsburgh) is the Emeritus Professor at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Its main areas of research are environmental communication, climate change communication and strategic studies of social movements. One of his doctoral students, into environmental communication, he was president of the Sierra Club three times (2007-2008, 2000, 2001 and 1994-1996) and served for 20 years in the Sierra Club's Administration Board. His published work includes chronic studies on the discourse of civil rights, peace, work and environmental movements. Cox is also on the management council of Earthwatch International, dedicated to the oceans and marine ecology. He currently advises the Sierra Club at his achievement in U.S., and serves in Editorial Councils of Periodicals as Environmental Communication: a daily of nature and culture. Cox advises US environmental groups in their programs on environmental initiatives and campaigned with former Vice President Al Gore and Singer Melissa Etheridge. Phaedra C. Pezzullo is an associate professor at the University of Colorado Boulder, and a double citizen with the US and Italy. Interdisciplinary background of it informs its research on environmental justice, climate justice, only transition, public advocacy and tourist studies. Her Book, Temples of Tourism (University of Alabama Press, 2007), won four professional awards, including the Jane Jacobs Urban Communication Book and the National Environmental Communication Book of Communication Association O. Among other publications, it covered green communication and China (Michigan State University Press, 2020) and environmental and environmentalism (MIT Press, 2007). She was a founding editor of Environmental Communication magazine and serves in her editorial advice. She offered herself in the National Group of Environmental Justice of the Sierra Club and Working Group of the Affinity Group, consulted with cities and counties in a simple transition, and was a delegate in COP21 in Paris. The pezzullo is a founding co-director of the Creative Climate Communication Center and Changing Behavior (C3BC) on her campus. She also likes recreation outdoors and cooking a plant-based diet. Robert Cox is an associate professor emeritus at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Its main areas of research are environmental and climatic communication and strategic studies of social movements. An internationally recognized scholarship that helped find the field of environmental communication, COX is Co-Editor of the Routledge Manual of Environment and Communication (2015; second edition), editor of Environmental communication of four-volume Series (Sage, 2016), and the author of numerous studies of environmental and climatic campaigns. He served three times (1994-1996, 2000-2001; 2007-2008) as president of the Sierra Club, the largest environmental organization of the US, and also was in the management council of Earthwatch International, whose mission is to "empower young people to act that restores and protects our water planet." Cox Tamba continues to advise environmental groups in their programs on environmental and climatic change initiatives and campaign with former Vice-President Al Gore, singer Melissa Etheridge and other public figures. He also likes hiking and trekking in the Himalayan, Europe and in the southern mountains of Appalachians in the United States. 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
